Faculties	○ For the Undergraduate level: We have seven faculties of Humanities and Social Sciences, Education, Informatics, Science, Engineering, Agriculture, and Global Interdisciplinary Science and Innovation. <u>Note: Shizuoka University will decide the faculty for successful applicant based on his/her major and study plan, Japanese proficiency and the capacity of faculties and so on. We don't accept any request for the change of faculty or campus.</u> ● For the Graduate (Master Course) level: We have three Graduate Schools of Humanities and Social Sciences, Education, Integrated Science and Technology.
Terms	Spring term : April 1 st ~ September 30 th Fall term : October 1 st ~ March 31 st *Applicants can choose either one term (6 months) or two terms (1 year).
Japanese Language Studies	SUOIC (Shizuoka University Organization for International Collaboration) provides Japanese language and culture classes for the international students from the beginner's level to the advanced level. The study plan will be confirmed after consulting with his/her faculty advisor and academic advisor. <p>Academic Studies</p>	<p>○At the Undergraduate level: <u><i>Most classes are given in Japanese.</i></u> If an applicant would like to study his/her major and to take these classes, the high command of Japanese must be required. (We have some classes in English as General Education. However, these aren't specialized subjects, it's very likely that these will not be approved as credit transfer to the exchange student's home university.)</p> <p>●At the Graduate (Master Course) level: The details will be offered at the orientation at the beginning of each term. (There are a few introductory courses given in English.) <u><i>Some courses in Agriculture, Science, Engineering and Informatics may be offered in English. All the courses in the Humanities and Social Sciences-and the Education are given in Japanese.</i></u></p>
<p>Obligation</p>	<p>All exchange students are under obligation to take classes for more than 7 classes (10 hours) per week.</p>
<p>Nomination</p>	<p>Applicant's name and his/her desired term must be notified of us by March 1, 2024. Accepted only through the partner university office <u>via email.</u></p>
<p>Application</p>	<p>Application documents and information must be submitted to us by March 13, 2024 through our Application website. A link of the Application website will be provided with only the partner university office after the nomination.</p>
