

# 1 Japanese Language Programs

- Japanese 1 ☐ (Beginners) Basic Japanese 4 classes/week ■ Japanese 2 ☐ (Elementary) Elementary Japanese 3 classes/week ■ Japanese 3 ☐ (Lower-intermediate) 3 classes/week "Reading & Grammar", "Listening & Vocabulary", "Writing & Speaking" Japanese 4 ☐ (Upper-intermediate) 3 classes/week "Reading & Grammar", "Listening & Vocabulary", "Writing & Speaking" ■ Japanese 5 ☐ (Advanced learners) 2 classes/week "Integrated Japanese"
- JP4 & JP5 are not offered at the Hamamatsu campus.
- One class is 90 mins  $\times$  15 weeks = 30 contact hours per semester.
- You can also attend classes one level higher or lower than your level. (e.g., A Japanese 3 student can attend JP2 and JP4, as well as JP3.)
- Academic credits are awarded to students who successfully complete the course.

Course for upper intermediate learners 2 classes / day ⇒ 10 classes / week

# (5) General Education

- Advanced Japanese classes for undergraduate international students as a part of the general education. It's open to exchange students.
- ☐ Japanese II · IV · VI (Fall semester)
- ☐ Japanese | · ||| · V (Spring semester)
- ☐ Japanese View(Spring in Hamamatsu, Fall in Shizuoka)
- \*One class is 90 mins  $\times$  15 weeks = 30 contact hours per semester.
- \*Academic credits are awarded to students who pass the examinations.

## **Academic Studies**

- Most academic courses are open to students.
  - (1) Undergraduate Levels:

An advanced level of Japanese is required, as most classes are taught in Japanese. However, some introductory General Education courses and some International Japan Studies courses in the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences are taught in English.

#### (2) Graduate Levels:

Classes in the Departments of Informatics, Science, Engineering, and Agriculture are taught in English.

■ Exchange students may choose subjects from any faculty. However, their specific faculty will be determined based on their study plan after our evaluation.



# **Recommended Study Plans**

- Exchange students are required to take more than 7 classes / week. The following plans are recommended for:
  - Japanese beginning students (①),
  - Japanese intermediate students(2) and
  - Japanese advanced students (3).

#### [1st Term]

- 1 10-15 Japanese classes from the Intensive Course
- 2 5-6 Japanese classes + 1-2 academic class(es)
- 3 2-3 Japanese classes + 4-5 academic classes

### [2nd Term]

Fewer Japanese classes and more academic classes.


A limited number of exchange students can avail of this scholarship.
