Eligibility	<p>Basic communication skills in Japanese or English are necessary.</p> <p>*To enroll in undergraduate courses other than those designed for international students (such as Japanese language programs), a Japanese language proficiency equivalent to at least JLPT N2 to N1 (CEFR B2 to C1 level) is required.</p> <p>Although this is not an official application requirement, it is necessary to understand the course content and complete assignments.</p> <p>Please be sure to carefully check the section titled "Academic Studies" for more details.</p>

	<p><u>Exchange students may take courses offered by faculties other than the one to which they are assigned.</u></p> <p><u>Please note that requests to change your academic advisor or assigned faculty cannot be accepted.</u></p> <p>●<b>Graduate (Master's degree) level:</b></p> <p>You can study in one of the following three graduate schools: the Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences, the Graduate School of Integrated Science and Technology, and the Interfaculty Graduate School of Mountain Watershed.</p> <p>The Graduate School of Integrated Science and Technology offers four majors: Informatics, Science, Engineering, and Agriculture.</p>
<b>Semester</b>	<p>Spring semester : April 1<sup>st</sup> ~ September 30<sup>th</sup></p> <p>Fall semester : October 1<sup>st</sup> ~ March 31<sup>st</sup></p> <p>* Applicants may choose a study period of either one semester (6 months) or two semesters (1 year).</p>
<b>Japanese Language Studies</b>	<p>The Shizuoka University Organization for International Collaboration (SUOIC) offers Japanese language and culture courses for international students, ranging from beginner to advanced levels.</p> <p>The study plan will be determined in consultation with a course coordinator, based on the results of the Japanese placement test.</p> <p>For information about Japanese language study (including some culture-related courses), please refer to the website below.</p> <p><a href="https://www.suoic.shizuoka.ac.jp/international/program/">https://www.suoic.shizuoka.ac.jp/international/program/</a></p> <p>The Shizuoka University Organization for International Collaboration offers various programs to help international students smoothly adapt to Japanese society. These include Interaction with local residents, homestay programs, and social gatherings with Japanese students.</p>

Academic Studies	<p>○ <b>Undergraduate level</b> : Most courses are conducted in Japanese. Students need Japanese language proficiency equivalent to JLPT N2 to N1 (CEFR B2 to C1) or higher in order to study their major and keep up with specialized courses. <b>There are very few general education courses offered in English, and these are not specialized courses. Credits earned from these English-taught courses may not be recognized by your home university. Please confirm with your home university before coming to Shizuoka University whether the credits for each course taken here will be accepted.</b></p> <p>● <b>Graduate (Master's degree) level</b> : Details will be provided at the orientation at the beginning of each semester. Some introductory courses will be offered in English. Some lectures in Agriculture, Science, Engineering, and Information Science are conducted in English, while all lectures in Humanities, Social Sciences, and Education are conducted in Japanese. <b>Please confirm with your home university before coming to Shizuoka University whether the credits earned for each course taken at Shizuoka University will be recognized.</b></p>
Obligation	Exchange students are required to take at least 7 classes (10 hours) per week. Exchange students enrolled in a graduate program should consult with their academic advisor to ensure their study plan amounts to the equivalent of 10 hours or more.
Nomination	<p><b>Deadline: October 1, 2025</b></p> <p>Please notify us of the nominees' name and desired study period via email. Only emails from the partner university representative will be accepted.</p>
Application	<p><b>Deadline: October 14, 2025</b></p> <p>Each student is expected to complete the application through the online system individually. Detailed instructions will be sent to the nominated students.</p>
Transcripts	Academic transcripts will be issued only if requested by the student.
Tuition	The tuition fee will be waived.
Living Expenses	<p><b>Monthly living expenses: Approximately 80,000 to 100,000 yen</b></p> <p>Applicants are required to submit documents such as a bank balance certificate or a financial support statement to prove that they have sufficient funds to cover expenses during their study period in Japan.</p>
Scholarship	There is currently no information available regarding scholarships.

<b>Accommodation</b>	<p>Shizuoka University has a student dormitory called the International Residence. Exchange students are given priority for accommodation in the student dormitory, and in fact, most exchange students reside there.</p> <p>As a general rule, exchange students are assigned to a "single unit (5 rooms per unit)."
