The International Exchange Lounge is a welcoming space where students can connect, share experiences, and join or organize cross-cultural events. It offers wonderful opportunities for Japanese and international students to build friendships and broaden their cultural horizons.



Support System

A tutor system is available to support international students in their daily lives, as well as in their Japanese language studies and academic research. In addition, a MEXT-certified "Careers in Japan Preparatory Course" is offered to provide support for job hunting in Japan.

International Student Dormitories

The university provides affordable housing for international students. All units are fully furnished and equipped with high-speed internet access. Each unit includes five private rooms and a shared common area. A multipurpose space is also available for dorm residents to gather and socialize.

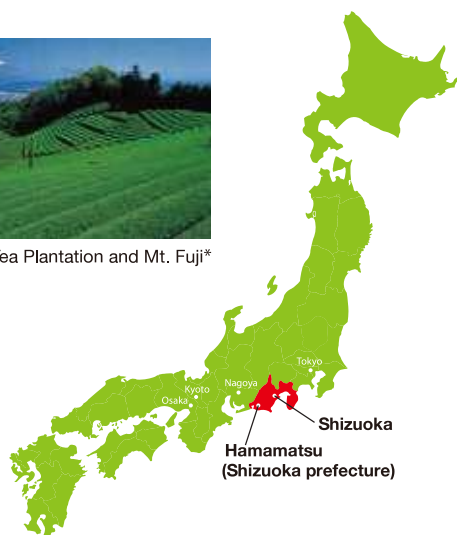

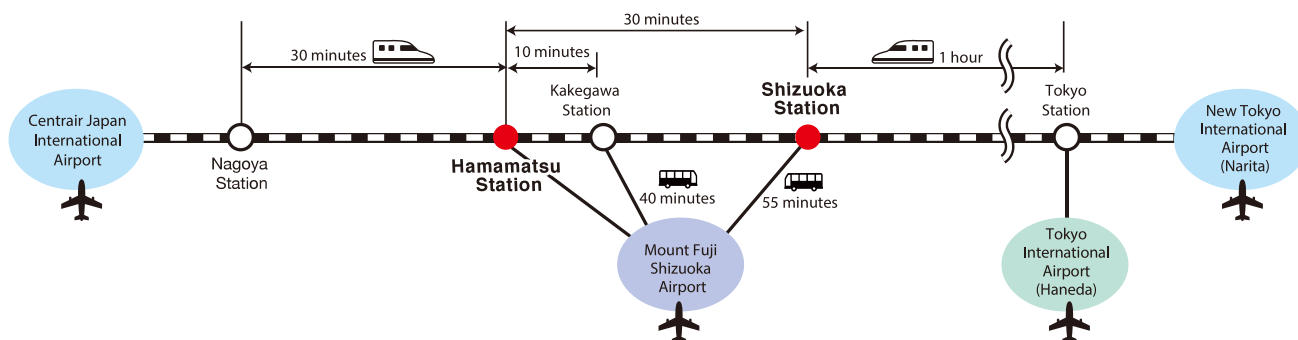
